Project Description

1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

The Rotary Club of Keller partnered with the Interact Clubs at 3 Keller ISD high schools to fundraise and purchase 3 Shelterboxes, which will provide immediate shelter and essential tools for survival in the wake of disaster. Each Interact Club, along with a Shelterbox rep, set up a tent in their school for the day to educate their fellow students. The following day, the Clubs solicited donations through "A Miracle Minute" conducted in the classroom for 1 minute. The clubs raised more than the required matching amount. Those fundraising campaign dates were: Central HS: March 1-3, Keller HS March 22-24, Timbercreek HS April 13-15.

- 3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.

 Three Rotariansm who work with the Interacts Clubs directly as mentors all year, helped coordinate the efforts. In addition, as we had Shelterbox set up a tent in each of the 3 high schools on different days, we had various Rotarians and Interacters help with setup/breakdown and "monitor the tent/equipment" during the school days they were set up. The Interacters conducted their "Miracle Minutes" to collect donations.
- 4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?

 At least 3 families (assuming 1 family per box)
- 5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project? We do not know where the Shelterboxes will be deployed as of yet but know that wherever they are sent, whether domestically or internationally, they will benefit those people who have the most need within that community. Many families continue living in a Shelterbox tent for months and sometimes years after the disaster.
- 6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?

 Shelterbox representatives (who happen to be Rotarians from a local club) provided the tent and equipment and help to set up/take down.
