### South California undergirded by equipment caused by Yorba Linda

**YORBA LINDA** firefighters were relieved at the hospital after being treated for fire burns suffered by ground equipment electrical substations. Yorba Linda Boulevard exploded Sunday. Authorities said Monday.

The incident, which included at least five injuries and knocked out power to 3,385 Southern Edison customers, occurred near Yorba Linda Boulevard about 10:30 a.m.

A captain and a firefighter were injured when a fire engine approached the scene, which had already been shut off after at least 10 injuries - to take a police and fire official.
