Thanks to the leadership of Mrs. Peterson and the Signal Hill Rotary Club (Fredy Dominguez, President, and Carol Churchill, member), we will have backpacks again this year ©

Here is some information so that you know what's going on. If anything changes, I'll let you know.

- Every student will receive a backpack with supplies.
- The planned distribution will be Wednesday, September 7th, period 6
- Joan Russell and Julie McCall, along with Student Ambassadors, will do the organizing and distributing. Let's all thank them for this!
- The supplies that I saw were:
 - 1 two inch 3 ring binder
 - 1 pencil sharpener
 - o 1 highlighter
 - 1 two pocket folder
 - o 2 pens

- 1 pack of college ruled notebook paper
- 1 pack of quad ruled graph paper
- 1 ruler
- 2 glue sticks
- After the distribution, if you have your students write thank you letters, there will be an envelope in the office that you can put them in. Please have the letters written and submitted by Wednesday, September 14.
- The backpack also contains a paper with all of those who contributed to the Backpack Project. The biggest donors were Costco, Signal Hill Police, and EDCO (refuse service—they provided the rolling bins and trucks to transport 2300 backpacks to us, Alvarado, and Signal Hill Elementary).
- How and why was this Backpack project accomplished? Several members of the Signal Hill Rotary Club had a vision to supply students with things they need to do schoolwork at home, knowing that many of our students don't have supplies at home. They spent all summer, calling businesses and walking door to door, asking Signal Hill residents to contribute. \$30,000 was raised. Then, teachers, Rotary Club members, some Boy Scouts, residents, college students, and members of the Muslim community assembled the supplies and backpacks. Just thought you might like to know. The Signal Hill community believes in us and wants to help.

ROTARY CLUB OF SIGNAL HILL KICKS OFF COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECT

The Rotary Club of Signal Hill is kicking off its 2016-17 Back to School Community Service Project. The goals is to raise \$30,000 to purchase backpacks and school supplies for all 2200 students attending Jesse Nelson Academy, Signal Hill Elementary and Alvarado Elementary School, according to Nancy Lauer, Chair of the Community Service Committee.

Last year members of the Signal Hill Club of Rotary International donated and packaged supplies for 2100 students, which included backpacks donated by Costco, transportation by EDCO, and assembly space by the Signal Hill Police Department, according to Lauer.

Lauer said that this year, Rotary Members will be seeking donations from local businesses starting in April, packing supplies in August, and delivering the backpacks at the opening of school in September.

Lauer said she is looking forward to working with community volunteers who support not only assisting families in need, but also Rotary International's theme: Service Above Self.

The School Supply Project is the largest community service project run by the 30 members of the Rotary Club of Signal Hill. Club membership has increased from 6 members in 2013 to over 30 members under the leadership of Robert Mendoza, President. As membership climbed, so did service to the community.

In 2015-2016, club members started more than 7 new community service projects: they packaged food for 50 low income senior citizens and started home deliveries to shut-ins. Members helped serve meals at the Signal Hill Seniors' Christmas Luncheon; worked with the Salvation Army to collect donations of more than \$1,800 in 2014 and 2015; provided volunteers to a three day leadership training for high school students at Rotary Youth Leadership Awards in Idlewild. They also helped form the first Rotary Interact Club in 50 years for middle school students to promote leadership and community service; many of those students participating in the Mayor's Annual Clean Up. The Club also participated in the Martin Luther King and Veteran's Day Parades. Internationally, the Rotary Club of Signal Hill allocated \$10,000 from the Rotary Foundation Long Donor Advised Fund established by Robert & Nancy Long to a clean water project in Guatemala in partnership with

Catalina and Long Beach Rotary Members.

The Rotary Club of Signal Hill meets every Thursday morning at 7:30 a.m. to 8:30 a.m. for breakfast at Curley's Café at Cherry and Willow in Signal Hill. Guests are welcomed.
