- All the projects will either assist students in learning or broaden their knowledge base the projects supported a variety of subject areas, including the arts, athletics, history, science, and special education.
- Several of the projects supported those with learning or physical disabilities, and these projects will help these students improve their life skills.
- The "Every 15 Minutes" project goal is to reduce the incidence of drunk driving. The long-term impact to the community of this project is measured in the lives that are saved through safer driving practices.
