3. Briefly describe your project (who did what, when and where did project activities take place?) in 100 words or less.

Negotiated and purchased new kitchen range and professional work table for Pocatello Salvation Army Outpost the only daily operating soup kitchen in the community serving a growing needy population. Kitchen stove upgraded to 5-burner, double-oven convection range that allows more and better food preparation. The kitchen work table was upgraded to 30 x 60 inch maple surface 36 inches high, 500 lb capacity with adjustable service shelf for more preparation area and reduced ergonomic strain on the tall Salvation Army cook. Project completed August, 2017.

4. In one brief sentence: who were the beneficiaries of the grant activities and how many of them were there?

Over 4,300 unduplicated homeless and low income persons were served in the last year, with 20-50 people eating one hot meal daily and where demand for soup kitchen meals is growing in Pocatello

20 Rotarians participated in fundraising activity. Two Rotarians helped the Salvation Army Outpost director who is also a Rotarian to get discounted prices and service agreement on the kitchen upgrade equipment.

Gate City Grays community baseball team provided opportunity for Pocatello Centennial Rotary Club to sell beverages at ball games for fundraising. Many Pocatello community people learned more about Rotary functions and projects.
