1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

OC's Special Spokes (OCSS) is a 510©3 dedicated to providing affordable adaptive tricycles to individuals with special needs through fundraising and community events. The goal is to provide mobility for children that will allow them to better engage in their community and have fun with their family and peers.

Six children – four from San Clemente, one from Anaheim and one from Moreno Valley – were outfitted with adaptive tricycles on Saturday, Dec. 23, at Courtney's SandCastle, a universal-access playground in San Clemente. The tricycles, known as AmTrykes, retail for \$2,000. Susan Hoang, founder of OC's Special Spokes nonprofit, got them at a discount and fundraises to help families afford any remaining cost.

Six AmTrykes were purchased with a \$5,400 grant from the San Clemente Rotary Club. Rotary participated in the award of the tricycles. The kids ranged from 5-16 years old. Regardless of age, the sense of glee and empowerment was huge.

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project? **This was a grant that enjoyed full club financial support. Thank you to do the District for the 50% matching grant. Participation/coordination involved a committee of 4 Rotarians who worked with OCSS,**

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples. **In addition to providing the grant, the club participated in the Dec 23 event when the kids were fitted with their new wheels. This event garnered local media attention.**

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project? **Six families**

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project? **Inclusivity is an important value to Rotary. This grant empowers kids with unique needs and also their families. One of the rewarding outcomes was to see siblings now be able to move together. 2017 was the second consecutive year that Rotary partnered with OCSS.**
