DISTRICT GRANT FINAL REPORT ROTARY CLUB OF AVALON 2017-2018

Project Description:

1). Due to geography and limited medical resources, the residents of Catalina Island must travel, by passenger boat, to the mainland for specialized medical care. The Catalina Island Medical Center and Clinic has a rural facility designation that is staffed primarily by family practice physicians. Residents of our community that require consultation with specialists, additional diagnostic testing, and/or surgery must travel to the mainland for their consultations and follow up care. In addition, several of our community residents are chronic dialysis patients or cancer patients needing frequent, sometimes daily trips to the mainland to receive their chemotherapy or radiation.

The Medical Transportation Grant Committee included 15 Avalon Rotarians. The Committee Chair met with the Catalina Island Medical Center business office and Social Services Department. It was decided that the Social Services department and Medical Staff would screen and validate patients that had referrals to the mainland for medical care. The Catalina Island Medical Center business office would do financial screening for potential grant recipients. To maintain health record privacy (HIPPA) of the recipients; the Rotarians were not given any specific medical information on the recipient's diagnosis.

Details of the District Grant were announced to the physicians and the nurse practitioners at a hospital "Medical Staff" meeting. Our club's Public Relation's Chair wrote an article about the transportation grant (see enclosed) and submitted it to our local newpaper, the Catalina Islander. Committee members met with the manager of the Catalina Express Avalon office to discuss ticketing policy. It was decided that gift cards with the Rotary Emblem be provided to the recipients to be exchanged for boat tickets. Catalina Express staff was instructed that the patient for their transportation for medical care could only use the gift cards, with the Rotary emblem. A letter was composed by a member of the Medical Transportation Grant Committee and translated into Spanish since some of our recipients do not have English as their primary language (see enclosed samples). A copy of this letter on Rotary Letterhead was placed in an envelope with each gift card.

A member of the Social services department would contact the Committee chair when a qualifying patient had an appointment scheduled. The recipient would be contacted by a member of the Committee to arrange a time and place for the letter and gift card to be presented.

Beneficiaries of the grant were Avalon community members who required medical travel to the mainland. Examples included diagnostic testing,

surgery, consultation with medical specialists, radiation, chemotherapy, radiation for cancer treatment, and kidney dialysis. With the median per capita income of Avalon being \$26,000 annually, many patients qualified based on the medical center business office criteria for "charity care". Potential recipients completed an application and a statement of financial condition (see attached).

- 2). 15 Avalon Rotarians comprised our Medical Transportation Grant Committee.
- 3). Committee tasks completed:
- a). Composed and submitted articles for the Local newspaper.
- b). Attended meetings with Catalina Island Medical Center and Catalina Express.
- c). Composed a letter for each recipient explaining the grant and what Rotary Club does.
- d). Dispensed gift cards to recipients at a mutually agreeable location.
- e). Provided transportation in their vehicles to and/or from the patient's home to the Avalon Boat Terminal when recipient's requested.
- 4). 47 local adults and children benefitted from this grant. Several of these recipients qualified for and received multiple gift cards. A total of 7 gift cards for subsidized commuter books (with 5 round trip tickets) and 47 round trip gift cards were purchased. Subsidized commuter books cards were issued by the City of Avalon to qualifying residents who were traveling frequently on a regular basis for their medical care.
- 5). Beneficiaries received medical care and treatments not available on Catalina Island. This will hopefully increase longevity and improve the quality of life for the grant recipients of our community. With Rotary International's focus on family, this grant helped ease some of the financial burden of the cost of travel. Many of our recipients were the primary breadwinners of their family and unable to work during their treatments or medical appointments. Often the Rotarians dispensing the gift cards had occasion to meet, not only the recipients but their families as well. I feel the interaction of the grant committee and the community at large had a positive effect on spreading Rotary's message.

ROTARY BOAT TICKET REQUIREMENTS

(Based on available funds)

- 1. Must prove financial need.
- 2. Must bring check stubs for past three months, bank statements, and last year's tax return.
- 3. To be eligible for a book must have 3 or more appointments confirmed within a 30 day period.
- 4. Must give 2 weeks advanced notice prior to appointment date.
- 5. Must provide Doctor's name, number and appointment times.

I understand that this is a grant and has limited funds and not readily available. I arn aware that only my name and contact information will be given to the Rotary contact responsible for giving me the tickets. I will contact the CIMC directly if I require tickets or have any issues with the program. If my financial status or medical status changes and I no longer need to receive boat tickets I will notify the Catalina Island Medical Center Representative for the program so I can be taken off the list. If I use tickets for personal reasons the Catalina Island Medical Center and Avalon Rotary has the right to refuse to continue to provide me tickets. I will only use Rotary tickets or Rotary commuter books for doctor appointments for myself. I give my permission to the Catalina Island Medical Center Representative to contact my Doctor and verify my appointment times. I will not hold the CIMC or the Avalon Rotary or either of their associates responsible to provide me tickets or books if the funds are not available or if I do not qualify.
