Project Title: Mosquito nets for Orphans in Uganda

## Project Description

1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries? We were able to purchase 150 mosquito nets to cover the beds of orphans at Malaika Orphans Children's Foundation in Kampala, Uganda. There are 216 orphans, and we had hoped to purchase enough for each child's bed. We will hope to purchase more in the near future.

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.

The President of Arlington Sunset Rotary Club and , Betty Bengo, started the orphanage in 2010 and established a 501©3 nonprofit public charity. She travels frequently to Uganda and has been directly involved in caring for orphans who become ill with Malaria, and other diseases caused by mosquitos.

The club members of the Bwebajja Rotary Club in Kampala researched the price of the mosquito nets and purchased the nets for us. Several of the members of their small club travelled to the orphanage, which is in an outlying area of Kampala, to help distribute the nets.

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project? Our hope is that the mosquito nets will protect the children from Malaria while they sleep, since mosquitoes are such a problem in the evening.
