1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

It was supposed to be 2 -one day Dental and Eye Clinics in Ensenada, Mexico. The first clinic was held in Oct 2019. A report for the October clinic is in the document downloads.

We did \$106,009 worth of services for the October 2019 clinic. There were Rotarians from the Califia Ensenada, Manteca, Santa Ana, San Juan Capistrano, and the Irvine Rotary Clubs- over 20 Rotarians. . We had exchange students, Interact students- at least 8 of them. We had dental students from Loma Linda Dental School and Volunteer Dentists from the US and Mexico totaled over 35. We had additionally non-Rotarian volunteers over 12. We saw over 201 patients at the October clinic. There was a School painting Project, a general cleanup project and playground equipment repaired.

The second clinic was set for 3-21-2020. A school was picked, hotels were booked, and volunteers gathered. Then the Covid-19 virus hit and the President shut down the border.

The clinic was canceled.

The report form the October 2019 clinic is downloaded.

Gave eye exams and provided prescription glasses. One Rotarian Gave the exam, Two Rotarians handled the eye chart and fitting

One Rotarian took pictures in between helping with the dental clinic.

One Rotarian did General organization, triage, drove the Dental van to Mexico as well as saw dental patients.

Rotarians handled signing in patients, handing out tooth brushes and tooth paste,etc. Some painted the school and worked on clean up. Some helped with work for the patients.

Kids who can see do better in school. Kids who have healthy teeth are more attentive and do better in school. Parents who can see are better able to work, sew and cook for their family.
