Project Description

1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

Our club provided funds for the purchase of 20 Chromebooks* and accompanying equipment for Richard J. Wilson, a low income, multi-lingual elementary school in Fort Worth. We had previously donated technology and other educational materials to R.J. Wilson. Rather than purchasing this donation directly as we have done in the past, the school worked through their district offices to purchase the Chromebooks after we provided the funds in September. This approach ensured the best pricing, product specifications that aligned with the school district requirements and the most efficient registration and set-up of the technology once obtained. The Chromebooks were received in mid-December. The students will benefit through use of these Chromebooks to increase knowledge, virtual experience, math and literacy skills.

*Original proposal indicated 24 Chromebooks would be purchased. With the purchase of additionally needed equipment, including a cart and locks, the grant covered the cost of 20.
