Project Title: Community Support

Project Description

1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

Metroport Rotary partnered with Metroport Meals on Wheels and the Roanoke Food Pantry to support the disabled, homebound and food insecure families. These organizations and the support provided were:

- Metroport Meals on Wheels, a locally based organization serving the homebound. This grant funded Winter Meals, Christmas stockings for Seniors and pet needs not otherwise covered during winter months. Winter Meals were not only funded through this grant, but the meals themselves are assembled and delivered by Metroport Rotarians as a Service Project.
- Roanoke Food Pantry, a locally based food pantry that serves food insecure families in the Roanoke area. These dollars funded their annual Christmas Basket program to provide turkey, ham or other as part of a full Christmas dinner for families in the Pantry's Christmas Adopt-A-Family program. Members assisted in packing the Christmas Dinners and supported pickup of the dinners as a service project. This year over 520 family members were touched by this program.

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project? 18

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.

- Metroport Rotarians and friends met staff at the Meals on Wheels facility in Roanoke and packed over 400 winter meals and then delivered meals to recipients in the surrounding areas.
- Metroport Rotarians met staff at the Roanoke Food Pantry and helped the staff pack Christmas dinners for the Pantries clients.

4. How many Non-Rotarians participated in the project? 23

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

- Not only did we help to provide nutritional food to families unable to buy it on their own and to men and women who are homebound or elderly, we also helped to deliver life-sustaining hope that comes from friendship and genuine concern. Metroport involvement reassures participants in these programs that meals will continue, nutritious food will be provided to kids and working parents in families that were/are financially challenged. This type of involvement fosters community economic development by providing families with a lifeline to keep them together, aid the disadvantaged & homebound, provide hope for parents and kids growing up in adverse conditions.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?

- We asked how we could help both Metroport Meals on Wheels and the Roanoke Food Pantry with their mission of feeding the hungry. They identified support that was critical to them and Metroport Rotarians acted to address the needs identified with the assistance of this grant.


