Project Description:

- 2. Briefly describe the project. What was done and where did the project activities take place? Explain how the beneficiaries and other community members were involved?

We provided \$2,000 to Meals on Wheels which is sufficient to provide 500 meals (both a hot component and a cold component for each meal) for qualifying recipients vetted by the MOW program. The meals are provided by the Poudre Valley Hospital. The MOW staff established an area outside the hospital where delivery volunteers pick up the meals. The volunteers deliver the meals according to a delivery sheet provided with the addresses and peoples' names. The delivery volunteers interact with the recipients if they are home and available. This interaction helps to ensure their safety and provide friendship along with the meal.

- 3. How many Rotarians participated in this project? Approximately 25 different Rotarians in the last year. Our club has been delivering MOW for several years.
- 4. What did they do? Please give at least two examples. 1.) One Rotarian manages the MOW program for our club. This person ensures that three Rotarians are singed up to deliver MOW every week during the year. 2.) Every week three Rotarians deliver MOW. Each route includes about four to a dozen recipients.

- 5. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project? It appears that between 12 and 36 non-Rotarians benefit each week.
- 6. Who are the beneficiaries and what is the expected long-term community impact of this project? The beneficiaries vary. Some are home-bound and either find it difficult to prepare their own meals or the meals are designed to provide support to the major care-giver. Others are not home-bound but fulfil the criteria of the MOW program to receive meals. MOW has strict guidelines for who qualifies for meals.
- 7. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was their role? The Poudre Valley Hospital provides the meals and the Meals on Wheels program manages the volunteers and determines who qualifies for the meals.
