1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

We pivoted to a new project within their organization, so that we can meet our May 30th deadline to file our 2022-2023 District Grant. Please refer to update below:

Bracken's Kitchen received the key to the next door building three weeks ago and had been working to make that a useful operational space. As mentioned previously, their goal is to build out a larger packaging space with semi-automated machines. Looking at timeline with the constructions and lead time with the machines, they are about 4 months out. (4-6 months lead time on machineries and equipment have been the norm nowadays sadly.)

Bracken's Kitchen is in the process of finishing their culinary classroom, to be ready for their first class (pending June 15th). We would like to apply the grant towards the computers for the students. The computers will be a great learning tool for the students on product and equipment ID, recipe and menu planning, research recipes and cooking technique, resume writing and job search.

The Rotary Club of Villa Park will tour the new building & classroom next door, to learn of Bracken Kitchen's next step and future goals & plan. We will then volunteer in the main kitchen, preparing & packaging meals for those served in the community.

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

This project will provide computers that will be a great learning tool for the students from surrounding and commuting school districts and youth organizations. It will open the opportunity for them to be educated on product and equipment identification, recipe and menu planning, research recipes and cooking technique, resume writing and job search. This will enhance their knowledge and make them better suited for a career in the culinary industry, non-profit space, and future job acquisitions. They will be well trained, and these skills will be used to give back to their local and potentially international communities.
