DONATION CONTRACT – District 4110

We, Eva Carleton, representing the Wheelchair Foundation; hereinafter referred to as "Foundation," and Reiner on behalf of the Rotary United Fund hereinafter referred to as "Consignee," agree to comply with the following contractual clauses:

Please choose below the sizes of the wheelchairs and the type of wheels most suitable for the beneficiaries. There are 4 options below.

First: The Foundation will purchase for the Consignee a total of 280 standard wheelchairs (thin wheels without air):

OPTION 1

- ___ wheelchairs have a measurement of 30 cm (12 inches) of seat width,
- ___ sillas have a measure of 35 cm (14 inches) of seat width,
- ___ sillas of wheels have a measure of 40 (16 inches) cm of seat width,
- ___ sillas measure 45 cm (18 inches) of seat width and,
- ___ sillas measure 50 cm (20 inches) of seat width.

Or

260 wheelchairs with special mountain bike wheels (each wheelchair comes with a pump and tire repair equipment)

OPTION 2

- ___ wheelchairs have a measure of 30 cm seat width,
- ___ sillas of wheels have a measure of 35 cm of seat width,
- ___ sillas of wheels have a measure of 40 cm of seat width,
- ___ sillas have a measure of 45 cm of seat width and,
- ___ sillas have a measure of 50 cm of seat width.

Or

OPTION 3

A mixture of both types of wheels: 270 mixed wheelchairs – 140 standard and 130 with special wheels. It is possible to order more standard and less special. Please indicate above the measures you need from both.



OPCION 4

Or you can order 230 regular chairs (standard wheel and/or with special wheels) and 10 Kanga chairs for a total of 240 wheelchairs. The Kangas are 30cm, 35cm, 40cm, 45cm, and 50cm (pediatric and adult)

CLASSIC CHAIRS

10 wheelchairs have a measure of 30 cm (12 inches) of seat width,
 0 wheelchairs have a measure of 35 cm (14 inches) of seat width,
 10 wheelchairs have a measure of 40 (16 inches) cm of seat width,
 55 chairs have a measure of 45 cm (18 inches) of seat width and,
 40 chairs have a measure of 50 cm (20 inches) of seat width.

MOUNTAIN WHEELCHAIRS

10 wheelchairs have a measure of 30 cm seat width,
 0 wheelchairs have a measure of 35 cm seat width,
 10 wheelchairs have a measure of 40 cm seat width,
 55 chairs have a measure of 45 cm seat width and,
 40 chairs have a measure of 50 cm seat width.

KANGA :

30cm (12") 8
35cm (14") 0
40cm (16") 0
45cm (18") 2
50cm (20") 0

Spare parts: Each wheelchair container comes with spare parts. It is mandatory that the consignee notifies the beneficiaries/institutions that there are spare parts and how to get the spare parts. The Wheelchairs Foundation pays to receive these spare parts and they must be used to repair wheelchairs. Please use them! IMPORTANTNOTE:

It is essential that the Consignee and the distribution organization(s) are aware that manual wheelchairs for general use, delivered by the Wheelchair Foundation, are not designed for people affected by some neuromuscular diseases that affect bone structure (maximum deformation of the limbs or torso, etc.) or motor control of the body (jerky movements, epileptic seizures, seizures, tremors, etc.) Individuals with these conditions require specialized chairs for their case, with special attachments for their safety and correct position, which the Wheelchair Foundation does not provide. Sitting a person with these conditions in a manual wheelchair for general use can result in severe harm to the patient and should be avoided at all costs. If the consignee or distribution entity is not able to know if a manual wheelchair for general use can be used for a patient, the Wheelchair Foundation recommends consulting a doctor or specialist, who determines if this chair is appropriate for that recipient.

Second: The Foundation will pay the costs of transportation to the port of Manzanillo.

Third: The Consignee must pay the costs of customs demacenaje or storage of wheelchairs. The Foundation will provide the Consignee with the original documentation on the donation before the boarding with the chairs arrives at the respective port, including: the Donation Certificate and the Non-Commercial Invoice. The Certificate of Carriage (B/L) is issued by the Carrier after the vessel has departed from China. The Consignee must carry out the destorage as quickly as possible and avoid additional payments or over costs due to delays in the destocking of wheelchairs. All costs for this concept due to delays in destocking are borne by the Consignee.

Special Instructions:

Important Note: the Consignee must understand the import process and know what steps to follow after receiving the documentation from us. Each country has different rules and there are also changes in the rules – the responsibility to follow the right steps to make customs procedures as fast as possible is the responsibility of the Consignee. Please inform yourself in sufficient time before the container arrives. All import costs and storage costs and delays (if there are import delays) are borne by the Consignee.

Fourth: The Consignee is responsible for delivering the wheelchairs to the beneficiaries of the same; for which he must:

1. Identify wheelchair beneficiaries who are children and adults who need a wheelchair but do not have the resources to purchase one. The mission of the Wheelchairs Foundation is that chairs are first delivered to individuals. It is possible to give some wheelchairs to institutions such as hospitals (for general use) but no more than 10% of wheelchairs. If there are other needs please consult with Eva Carleton.
2. Organize a ceremony of delivery of the wheelchairs, with the participation of the national organization indicated in the Fifth clause of this contract; as well as the members of the Foundation and other special guests, who will help in the distribution of the same. This ceremony of delivery of chairs must schedule a space in the agenda to hold the respective press conference, whose call to the National media must be carried out by the Distributor. Send the Foundation photographs of each of the beneficiaries of the wheelchairs. Such photographs must comply with the specifications set forth in the annex to this contract called "Photographic Instructions and Requirements."



1. The Distributor sends a report of the deliveries of the wheelchairs that includes the names of the beneficiaries, address, age, type of illness and date of delivery.

Failure to comply with clause Four will mean for the Distributor never to receive a donation from the Foundation; since their conduct implies for the Foundation the impossibility of showing the donors (through photographic identification) the good use that has been made of their resources.

Fifth: The wheelchairs covered by this donation contract have been sponsored by Rotary District 4110 and the Wheelchair Foundation.

Sixth: The Consignee must make all communication for the fulfillment of this contract with Eva Carleton through any of the following means: by email to: ecarleton@wheelchairfoundation.org.

Seventh: The Consignee must send a scanned copy of this contract duly signed by its representative to Eva Carleton.

ANNEX 1:

How to take the photos:

1. Photograph the beneficiary properly seated in the donated wheelchair.
2. Please photograph each beneficiary vertically, rotating the camera 90 degrees from its normal position. Make sure the beneficiary and wheelchair are clearly visible when you take the picture. Please do not photograph down, but take a low position when you see the photograph of the person and please bring a smile to the face if you can.

Please do your best to provide us with good photographs of each beneficiary as the only time to obtain this information is at the ceremony of delivery of the chairs. The information that the photographs provide us is used in our efforts to find more donors; as well as to show those who have donated money that their resources were well used, all of which makes it easier for us to provide wheelchairs to more people who need them.
