1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

The purpose of the grant project was to upgrade or replace two or more Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) in the Garden Grove Community. These AED's were previously donated by the Garden Grove Rotary Club to various community organizations and facilities to save the lives of persons with sudden cardiac arrest. Since the initial donations, these units were in need of repair and/or replacement. Due to changes in technology, it was determined that purchasing two new replacement units was preferred to upgrading older units.

- One AED replacement unit was purchased in August 2022 and issued to the Garden Grove Police Department SWAT Team in September 2022 and one AED replacement unit was purchased in October 2022 and issued to The GEM Theater in December 2022, in conjunction with the Garden Grove Rotary Club's annual theater night fundraiser.
- 2. How many Rotarians participated in the project?

Four Rotarians participated in the project: Joe Hammer, Scott Weimer, Bill Annan and Maria Stipe

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.

Maria Stipe and Scott Weimer prepared and submitted the grant application. Scott Weimer and Bill Annan worked with past AED recipients to determine and prioritize replacement needs. Scott Weimer ordered and delivered the replacement units. Joe Hammer made related payments and maintained documentation.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?

Eight members of the Garden Grove Police Department Swat Team and numerous members of the community will continue to be protected from sudden cardiac arrest on a daily basis by having a reliable AED unit that travels with the SWAT Unit on a daily basis. All of the actors and patrons of The GEM Theater in Garden Grove (approximately 175 people each day) will also continue to be protected from sudden cardiac arrest as a result of having a reliable AED unit on site at the Theater.

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

This project will enable important community organizations to continue to administer life-saving support should an officer or member of the public experience sudden cardiac arrest.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?

AED Institute of America provided discounted pricing in support of the project.
