1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

The Community service project benefited youth in neighborhoods where transportation to school was a challenge for students. It is critical to provide options for students to commute to school on time when transportation is unavailable due to parent/caregiver not having a vehicle, their work schedule, students lack of bicycle or scooter.

Club members and volunteers were invited to participate to assist youth in assembling skateboards, helmet use workshops and safe-riding techniques. Skateboards were provided to 43 students in junior high and high school. We partnered with KidWorks who provided the venue free of charge as well as provided staff to assist. The event took place on Saturday, October 29th.

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project?

The club members all participated in organizing and planning; eight were present at the event. We had five members of our family volunteer and three community volunteers who were expert skateboarders who provided the technical assistance with assembly of skateboards and use of tools.

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.

Rotarians provided assistance in assembling skateboards, cutting skid tape, running small groups through training / educational workshops to review safety when riding skateboards and importance of wearing a helmet. Ross Minion from Newport Rotary provided free helmets and set up training visuals.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?

There were 43 young students in jr. high and high school who benefited in receiving a free skateboard. The students worked 2 hours with Rotarians in putting the pieces together to assemble the skateboard from skid tape, trucks, wheels, etc. They learned how to switch out wheels and were given tools.

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

The students, who came from various under-served communities in Santa Ana, now have a mode of transportation to get them to school and to their after school program. They were trained in safety, provided a helmet to those who did not own one, and given an introduction to Rotary Club.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?

The County Project provided 3 expert skateboarders to facilitate the assembly of skateboards. Ross Minion from Rotary Newport provided Safety Training Booth.
