The third annual Fountain Hills Community Health Fair brought healthcare professionals together for residents to talk to, provided opportunities for residents to learn from healthcare presentations on a variety of topics, offered onsite health screenings (mammography) and blood donation opportunities, and generated grant income for the community health and wellness fund.

When (dates) and where (city, state and country) did project activities take place? Saturday, January 25, 2025

Who were the beneficiaries? Fountain Hills residents and families needing emergency financial assistance for health and wellness issues.

- 2. How many Rotarians participated in the project? 20
- 3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples. Four Peaks Rotarians helped with set up, staffed the welcome table, introduced speakers, and managed giveaways.
- 4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project? Nearly 500 residents attended the health fair; 18 families benefitted directly from grant proceeds including 1) 12 families with FHUSD students who were unable to pay for school lunches, 2) five Fort McDowell students ages 5-7 who needed eye exams and eyeglasses, and 3) one family struggling to pay the ER bill for their 12 year-old who collapsed at school and was subsequently diagnosed with a heart condition.
- 5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project? This annual event encourages Fountain Hills residents to be healthier by introducing them to local healthcare professionals, learning about healthy lifestyles, and taking advantage of onsite health screenings.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role? We coordinated with the Fountain Hills Kiwanis clubs which held its blood drive on the same day in the same location.
