Phase 2 of the Rio Verde Country Club's Project Renew is set to begin this summer, focusing on upgrades to Quail Run's irrigation system, turf reduction, brown spot remediation, and pond restoration. Crews from Landscape Unlimited will return to complete this phase, with work expected to begin in early April.

Quail Run To Close on Apr. 15

Quail Run will close on Apr. 15 and remain closed until the Fall overseed. During the closure no cart and walking traffic will be allowed. The area will be an active construction zone due to open trenches and heavy equipment.

Summer Course Tours

Organized course tours will be scheduled throughout the summer, allowing members to view the project's progress. Weekly updates will also be provided as the start date approaches.

On Tuesday, Mar. 4, Rotary Club members John Colucci and Hans Schols met with Pastor Cathy Northrup and presented the Church with a LifeVac System that will be available in Founders Hall.

The LifeVac devices are specifically designed to save a child or adult from choking from food or small object getting lodged in the throat. As of March 2025 these life saving devices have saved 3,642 lives.

Past President John Colucci notes that "Rotarians are ordinary people doing extraordinary things. When the idea of donating LifeVac units was brought up at a club meeting, we knew it made perfect sense to provide each food serving entity in Rio Verde, as well as the Fountain Hills schools, these units.

The devices are very simple to use by any adult. LifeVac has saved many lives and our club is honored to provide units that will assist in keeping Rio Verde residents and visitors safe."

Please tell your remodeling contractors and your landscapers that they are not allowed to use the dumpsters.


Also do not leave items on the ground outside of the dumpsters. Republic Services drivers will not pick them up.
