Project Description:

The project was an update to El Centro's website, a vital fundraising tool to attract donors and foundations. Our member, Larry Woodard's media company (GSA), met with El Centro's staff to plan the site's look and content, in Jan-March 2025 through virtual and inperson meetings. Larry's staff updated photos, and trained staff on how to keep the site updated. The new website, **elcentrohispano.org**, was launched at the end of April 2025. We have received great feedback from the El Centro team on the appearance and ease of maintenance of the website.
