PROGRAM INFORMATION

Our mission is to serve all youth of Greater Orange County by providing fun, quality marine educational programs year round that instill solid values, promote effective teamwork, develop leadership skills, teach nautical safety skills, and provide a venue for all to enjoy the wonders of the waterfront.

Since 1937, the Newport Sea Base has provided fun and valuable educational maritime-based programs to all youth. Year-round, girls and boys learn oceanography, marine biology, environmental science, boating safety, dinghy and keelboat sailing, canoeing, kayaking, motor boating, and other aquatic-related subjects.

Registration Options

ONLINE REGISTRATION via the link on www.newportseabase.org. Accepted forms of payment are American Express, Discover, Master Card and Visa, as well as cash or check. Payment is required to guarantee a place in a class. Registration cutoff is 3 p.m. on the Wednesday before start of class

Methods of Payment

Registration is not guaranteed without full payment. Accepted forms of payment are: American Express, Visa, Master Card and Discover.

Refund Policy

A \$20 (per class) processing fee will be charged for all refunds. Transfer to another scheduled class will be processed without additional fees on a space available basis only.

Parking

Parking at the Newport Sea Base is limited. Please carpool if possible. Additional public parking is available at the Newport Beach city parking lot at the intersection of Tustin and Avon streets. Allow 15 minutes walking time to the Newport Sea Base.



Proper Attire

All classes require closed-toe shoes (no sandals, roller shoes or Crocs). Please note that shoes and clothing worn during boating classes will probably get wet, perhaps even soaked. Consequently, 1) Avoid wearing cotton or jeans; 2) Pack a towel and a dry change of clothes. It can get cool on the water so you may also want to bring a jacket or windbreaker. Sunglasses, sunscreen, hat, and water are strongly encouraged. Life jackets are provided for all aquatics classes and must be worn at all times on the docks and on the boats.

Lunches

If your child will be here all day, please send him/her with a lunch. Lunch is not available for purchase on the property and leaving the facility for lunch, other than when accompanied by a parent, is not permitted. The lunch period is supervised.

Swim Check

The symbol above indicates that proof of swimming proficiency is required for participation in class. Swimming proficiency (75 yards of any of the following strokes: sidestroke, breaststroke, trudgeon or crawl; then another 25 yards of an easy backstroke, followed by demonstration of ability to float) may be proved by 1) Newport Sea Base swim check; 2) proof of current year swim check conducted by a recognized agency.
