Proposed Projects for 2025-2026

1. Ensenada, Mexico Dental and Eye Clinic - \$8,000

Beginning in 2004, this Dental and Vision project has been held twice a year (with the exception of Covid) in Ensenada, Mexico. It consists of two days of service, at a rural school in Ensenada Mexico. We partner with Irvine Rotary and Club Rotario Ensenada Calafia. We will serve 120-300 kids (dental & vision) and 30-70 adults (vision). These are from the under-served communities of rural Ensenada, Mexico.

The funds are used to pay for dental supplies and eyeglasses, as well as the operating expenses (fuel and maintenance) of the Dental van that transports all of the equipment and supplies for 12 full dental stations, hygiene, sanitation, x-ray equipment, etc. It also pays for the hotel accommodation of the USC Dental students (they pay for their own transportation). The project has two Clinic dates,_October 10-12, 2025, and March 2026. The Ensenada Club selects a school in an underserved part of Ensenada and helps with all the local logistics. The Ensenada Club provides volunteers for the day and identifies a hands-on project for the day. The Ensenada Club will bring their Interactors and exchange students to help. They usually have 15-20 Rotarians attend.

Each clinic sees 70-100 children. We anticipate 20-25 Club members to participate in each clinic. Each clinic also has approximately 30 Dental students, 30 non-Rotarians, about 9 Dentists and 1 optician. We usually provide around \$50,000 worth of services. Club Rotarians engage in more than 200 hours of service per clinic to help manage the patient flow, translate, work with the dental and vision team to assist with fitting glasses and testing on the eye chart and help with a school improvement project.

Our projected budget for this project is \$8,000: District grant funds, \$2,000 and Club Funds, \$6,000. This funding will be used for supplies, including glasses given out. No funds are distributed in Mexico. Funds will be deposited in the SJC Rotary Club Foundation account and be paid to the two California local partners for supplies.

2. Students Run LA (SRLA) - \$7,000

The San Juan Capistrano Rotary Club sponsors Marco Forster Middle School (MFMS) Roadrunners in the Students Run Los Angeles (SRLA) program. MFMS was the first middle school in the Capistrano Unified School District (CUSD) to participate in the Students Run LA Marathon Program and is now in its 18th year. The team consists of approximately thirty-five (35) 7th and 8th grade students. Coaches include teachers, administrators, and other running enthusiasts from the community.

Training begins in September with the start of the school year for the LA Marathon event which occurs in March each year. The main goal or objective of SRLA is to help students work hard to set long-term goals; help with character development and build self-confidence and self-esteem. The program instills discipline, determination and a sense of pride in those runners who accomplish their goals. The participants get special recognition at the school's year-end award ceremony.

Club members provide a send-off for the team the day before the marathon providing encouragement. Those Rotarians that are "runners" and are interested are encouraged to participate in training. Additionally, Rotarians are encouraged to attend the event and cheer on the team. Post event, the Marco Forster Middle School leader joins us at a club meeting with 4-5 of the participants who make comments on the race.

As a South Orange County participant, our kids travel the furthest for the event and training at pre-marathon events in LA and Ventura County. In the past, the SJC Rotary Club sponsored lodging for the overnight stay in Los Angeles the day before the event. This year, grant funds would allow the club to provide additional funds to offset the cost of transportation to pre-event training events, as well. Funding for the team is a collaborative effort. The team members sell snacks and drinks at various school events to raise funds for their costs. Parents are encouraged to contribute \$100 per student; however, some cannot afford to help. Also, one local business purchases sweatshirts with "Marco Forster Marathon Team" imprinted on it.

Our budget for this project is \$7,000: District grant funds, \$2,000 and Club Funds, \$5,000. The grant funds will be deposited in the SJC Rotary Club Foundation account and paid to Marco Forster Middle School ASB and deposited in into the school's

account. Funds are drawn as needed for lodging and transportation costs. MFMS oversees the finances of the team.

3. Gilchrist House - \$9,000

Gilchrist House, in San Clemente, is a family-safe transitional shelter for homeless women and mothers with children. The shelter is managed by Family Assistance Ministries (FAM), which serves San Clemente, San Juan Capistrano and other South Orange County communities. FAM provides one-on-one case management and job search coaching, financial counseling and life skills training to the residents. It is an environment where the residents work to bridge the gap between dependency and self-sufficiency, leaving the shelter after finding a job and their own housing.

The shelter landscaping has fallen into disrepair and is sorely in need of repair for safety and aesthetic reasons. This project would renovate and upgrade the shelter landscaping to give the residents a much more pleasing environment and the children a better and safer place to play. The project is anticipated to occur in Summer 2025, beginning in July pending grant approval.

The shelter houses 30-50 residents on an on-going basis. Project area cleanup and certain activities would be provided by Rotarian volunteers and residents. Certain activities will require professional installation as opposed to volunteer labor.

Our projected budget for this project is \$9,000: District grant funds, \$4,000; Club Funds, \$4,000 and a contribution from San Clemente Sunrise Rotary Club, \$1,000. The funds would be used to directly purchase or reimburse Rotarians for plants, other materials/supplies and professional installation as needed.
