

Zavala's History and Vision for the Future

History Zavala was founded in 2001 by a group of individuals that recognized the need to develop Hispanic leaders in the Wichita Falls community. After initial meetings, a steering committee was formed in 2002. Topics of discussion centered around ways to engage the Hispanic population in all sectors of community life. Additionally, barriers keeping Hispanics uninvolved were identified and discussed. In 2003, the Secretary of State of Texas issued a formal charter and approved Zavala's By-laws and Articles of Incorporation. Then, in 2006, Zavala was granted non-profit status and was recognized as a 501 (c) 3 not for profit organization. The organization is active and busy.

Future Zavala has a vision to serve the Wichita Falls community in a variety of ways. Service is at the forefront of our Mission. Our service is demonstrated most vividly through educational programs and supporting the development of a education centered culture as an avenue to empowering the Hispanic community. In an effort to celebrate our beautiful culture, we will continue to enrich the experiences of the citizens in Wichita and the surrounding areas with cultural programming like Calle Ocho and Las Posadas.

On the horizon, Zavala sees an even brighter future for our community. Imagine a Hispanic Cultural Community Center to carry out the mission of SERVE, CELEBRATE, EDUCATE and EMPOWER.
