1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?		
The projected consisted in the provision of fresh food through the Second Harvest Food Bank of Orange County, to feed needy families in Dana Point and immediate surrounding areas. We calculate that the funds we provide, enables us to feed the equivalent of 300 families for the year. We obtain 5,000 pounds of fresh fruit, vegetables, and dry goods directly to the communities where low-income individuals in Dan Point live. We had 6 schools involved in the program, 2 high schools, 2 middle schools and 2 Elementary schools involved in the program. The students and families that received food were chosen by the Principal and the school social counselor based on need, MBSR collaborated by having direct contact with the Principal and counselors. The following schools will be the beneficiaries Dana Point Hills High School, Niguel Hills Middle School, Aliso Niguel High School, Marco Forster Middle School, HR Dana Elementary and Kinishota Elementary plus the SJC and Aliso Viejo Boys & Girls Club.  The members of MBSR reserve the food truck for two dates during the year and secured the St Timothy's Church location for distribution. MBSR members help register and identify the families coming to obtain the food. MBSR members packed and gave bags with fresh food for the families in the community of Dana Point.

Please give at least two examples.</li> <li>We learned about the food program. Then contacted Second Harvest for the food truck. We secured the site at St. Timothy's Church in Dana Point for the food distribution. We contacted the DP high school. Middle Schools and Elementary schools, The SJC and AV Boys &amp; Girls Clubs and families from St. Timothy's Church so we could benefit them with fresh food. We set up the food outside the truck for distribution, packed the food, and distributed to the families (see video).</li> </ol>
