1. Briefly describe th	ne project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

Our mission was to inspire and educate through presentations, participation and experience. First the students checked in and had a breakfast catered by the Aliso Niguel High School Culinary Arts department. About 20 high school students obtained vocational experience catering this event.

Vocational Day 2015 is a morning program designed for high school juniors and seniors where they hear from prominent leaders in the community about their careers and leadership. This year we held the morning at the Capistrano Valley District office board room. This was the first time many of these students had ever seen the district office that oversees their schools! We had a warm welcome from our Rotary Club President who explained what Rotary is and how they could get involved. The Superintendent also spoke briefly followed by three incredible speakers. The students asked great questions, participated in raffles during the breaks and were treated to a delicious breakfast prepared by the schools own Culinary Arts Program! It was a really great experience for students in the culinary program to have this opportunity as many of them are looking for this as a career path!

A portion of the Vocational Day funds are used for the pizza and snacks served at the Interact meetings. The Interact Club discusses Vocational topics at most meetings.

Our past president took 3 Interactors to the World Peace Conference.

We are finishing our year of Vocational Service with a dinner with presentations of everything accomplished over the year, "The Interact Celebration".
