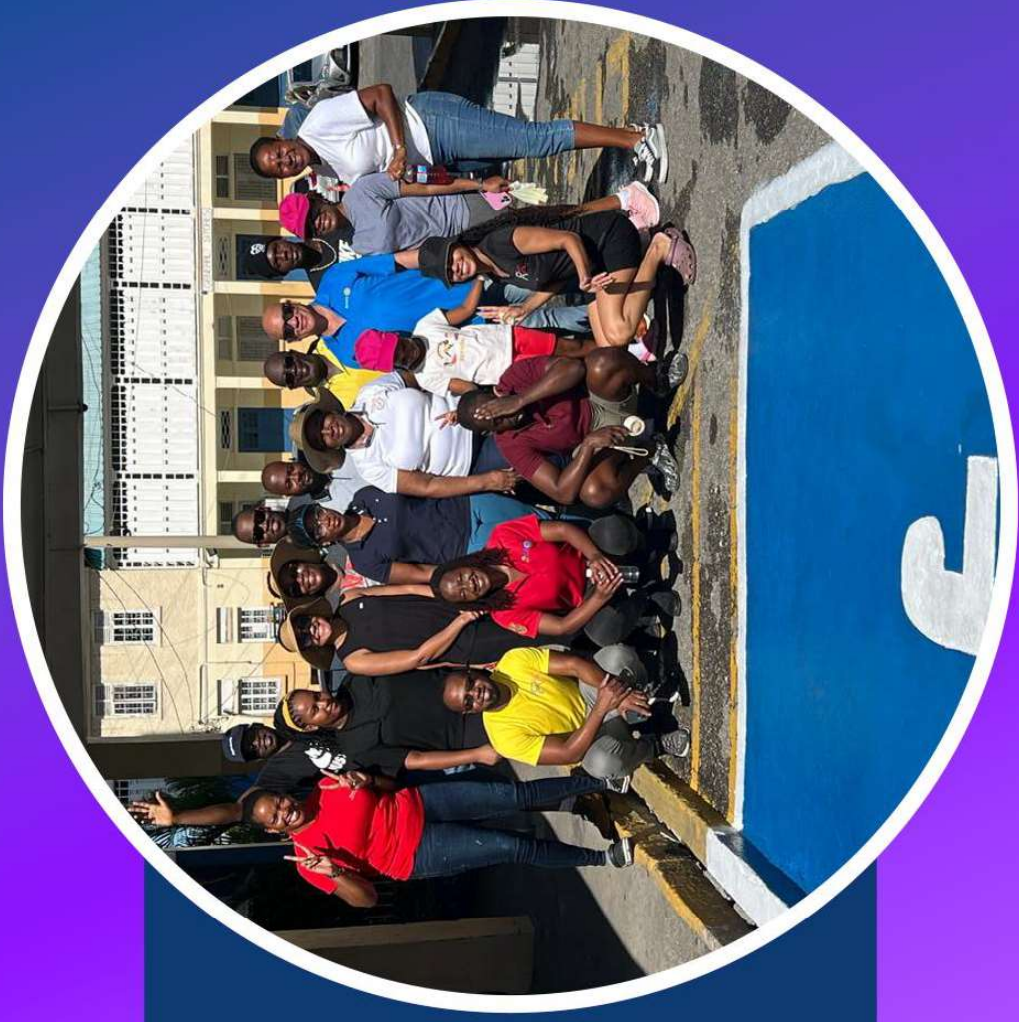

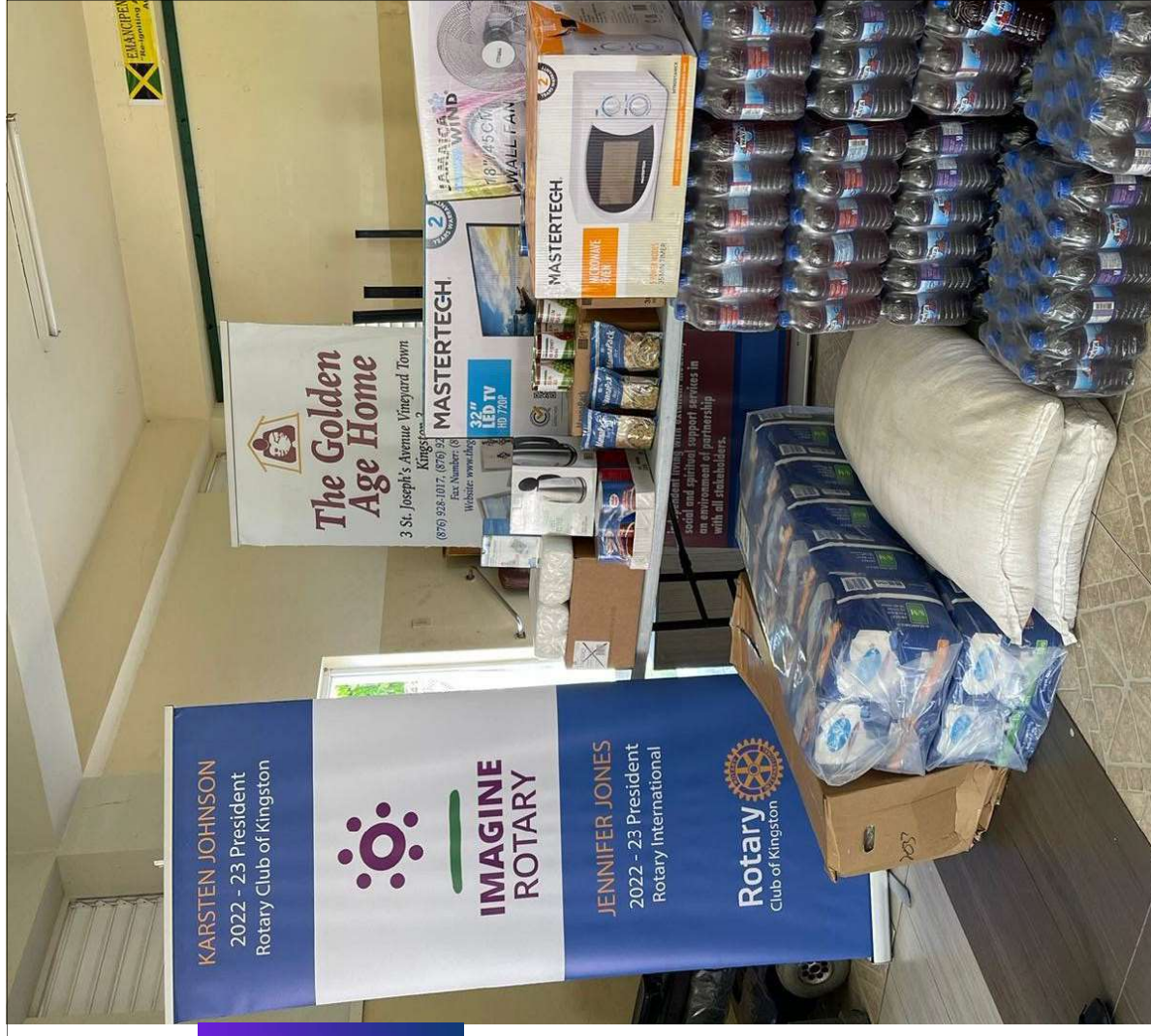

The provision of furniture and learning resources will directly contribute to the school's ability to obtain Early Childhood Accreditation, ensuring higher education standards for visually impaired children.



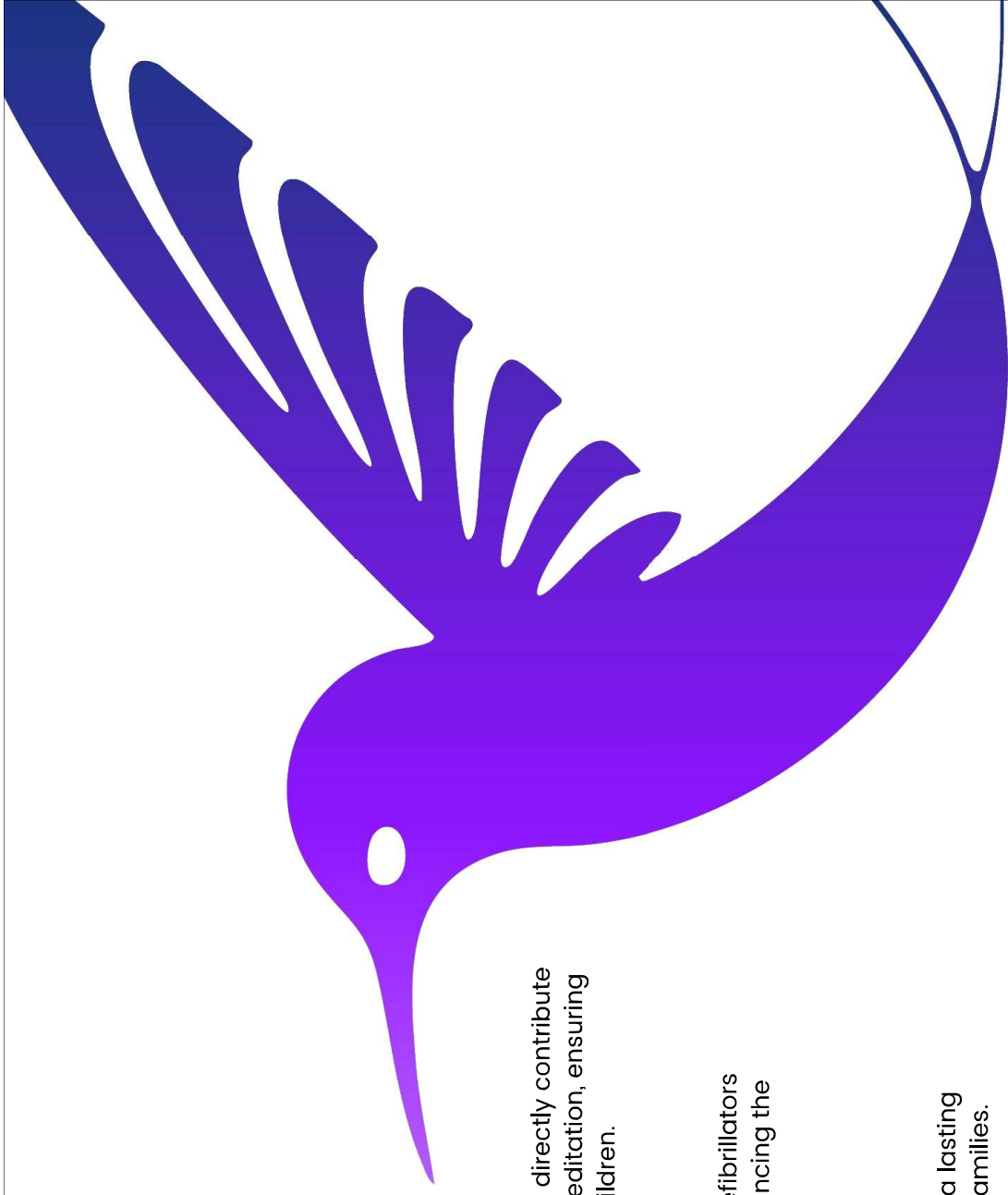
Health and Safety
