Executive Summary

HDNP Nepal seeks a grant of \$30,000 to implement our Female Goat Distribution Project. By providing 200 female goats and 100 male goats at \$85 per goat, we will empower marginalized communities in Nepal through improved income generation and sustainable agricultural practices. This initiative promotes economic growth, community development, and self-sufficiency while preserving the dignity of disadvantaged groups.

Organization Background

To promote dignity, self-sufficiency, and opportunity for Nepal's most vulnerable communities, including Dalits, backward castes, and economically oppressed populations.

Statement of Need

The **Musahar community**, often referred to as the "rat-eaters" due to historical stigma, is among the **most socially excluded and economically disadvantaged groups in Nepal**. With extremely limited access to land, jobs, or education, Musahar families often survive as landless laborers, living below the poverty line.

This project addresses urgent needs such as:

- Chronic poverty due to lack of sustainable livelihood options
- Food insecurity and malnutrition in rural Musahar settlements



Social exclusion that prevents integration into mainstream economic activity

By providing female goats—a proven asset for income generation—we can help Musahar households develop self-sufficiency, break cycles of poverty, and regain control over their futures.

Project Description / Proposed Activities

Upon receiving funding, HDNP Nepal will execute the following steps:

Goat Procurement & Distribution

- Purchase 300 healthy goats (one per family) at \$85 each
- Distribute directly to pre-identified, eligible Musahar families in rural districts

Training & Ongoing Support

- Deliver workshops on basic goat care, feeding, housing, and veterinary awareness
- Provide follow-up visits and local volunteer support for animal health and income guidance

Monitoring & Evaluation

- Develop simple tracking systems for growth, offspring count, and household income changes
- Collect success stories and impact feedback for program refinement and reporting

Goals & Objectives

Goal: Uplift 300 Musahar families by providing them with a sustainable incomegenerating asset and practical livestock training.

Objectives:



- Distribute 200 female goats and 100 male goats to vulnerable Musahar households
- Train 300 recipients in goat rearing, care, and small-scale livestock management
- Help families generate income through milk, meat, or offspring sales within one year
- Promote self-confidence, community participation, and social inclusion

Target Population

This project targets:

- Musahar families, particularly women and single mothers
- Households living in extreme poverty without land or stable employment
- Rural districts in Nepal where Musahar settlements are heavily concentrated and underserved

Beneficiaries will be selected in coordination with **local ward leaders, women's groups, and HDNP Nepal volunteers**, ensuring fairness and maximum impact.

Budget & Funding Request

Note: All project logistics, training, and monitoring will be covered by HDNP Nepal's volunteer network and existing community partnerships.

Sustainability Plan

This initiative is designed for **long-term sustainability**:

- Goats will reproduce, increasing herd size and economic returns for families
- Beneficiaries will be trained to care for and multiply their livestock independently
- Communities will be linked with local veterinarians and cooperatives for ongoing support
- Success from this pilot phase will help attract **future donor support** to scale the program in other districts
