Through this district designated funds grant, we want to provide funding for digging a water well for the community in Ibanda, Uganda East Africa. Lack of clean nearby water is a source of disease, poor hygiene, illiteracy, and preventable child deaths.

Describe how the benefiting community will maintain this project after grant funding has been fully expended.

Ibanda, Uganda (southwest Uganda, not far from the Rwanda border) has no running water in the community. It is a town of approximately 7,000-8,000 people. The closest water they have is a muddy swamp approximately 1 hour walk away. The children have to walk this hour multiple times per day with five gallon cans on each arm or head to fetch this muddy water. This well will enable the community create the time to educate their children, improve literacy, build an economy, and reduce infant death.

Describe specific activities of the host and international partners in implementing the project. What will the Rotarians who are members of the partner clubs do during the project? The host partner will provide local project and financial management along with leadership in the local community. The job site will be visited on an as-needed basis but no less than once every 2 weeks. The international partner has relations with firms and groups that have direct ties with the host community and remain in close contact. It is possible for international partner to visit & help with the project. The well will be built by a local contractor experienced in digging wells in the region. E-mail and telephone correspondence and communication will be maintained between the host partner, international partner, cooperating organization to monitor the project, share expertise and prepare the required reports. The host partner and cooperating organization will set-up a project committee to train the users as well as establish a method of charging usage fees to enable sustainable maintenance of the water well. Both the host partner and international partners will publicize the project to their respective local media. The international partner is working the law firm of Semanoff, Ormsby, Greenberg & Torcia as our connection to the Bubaare Parish and Fr. Joseph Sserugo. The law firm has already provided \$9,000 directly to the parish for this project.





I had my meeting last week with my African team and we have the following information to report:

1. **WHO WE ARE.** I am involved with an organization called "Building A Bridge To Uganda", which is a Pennsylvania non-profit corporation that recently filed for 501C3 status, which we are confident we will receive. Our mission is to help the people of Ibanda, Uganda. This past year approximately 20 members of our group spent up to three months in Ibanda, and our mission is primarily to help the people of Ibanda with education, food, clothing and other support. It is our intention in the next year to build a 700 student high school.

2. **THE NEED.** Ibanda, Uganda which is in southwest Uganda, not far from the Rwanda border, has no running water. It is a town of approximately 7,000 to 8,000 individuals. The closest water source they have is a swamp which has muddy water, and children have to walk approximately an hour each way to get this dirty water. They walk with five gallon cans carrying one in each arm and sometimes with them on their heads. If the children could be relieved of "fetching" water, then they can spend more time on their studies. Therefore, the need is great. We have provided \$9,000 of funding to our contact in Ibanda for a water well. We are hoping that is where you guys can come in, especially with the logistical expertise to pull this off and with additional funding to complete the project.

3. **THE CONTACT.** Our contact over there is Joseph Sserugo. Joe is a friend of my family and over the years, our group has provided him with literally over \$100,000 of funds. Joe has been accountable for all of it and is a very trustworthy individual.

If Rotary of Horsham is interested in pursuing this exciting project, which could make a huge difference in many people's lives in Africa, perhaps it would be best that you contact Joe directly. Let me know whether you want his e-mail address or his cell phone number, and I can provide it to you. Let me know what your club thinks. I look forward to hearing from you soon.
